Organize, publicize, and participate in bi-monthly Immigration Clinics in partnership with Greater Boston Legal Services.

Produce/sponsor/participate in other educational and advocacy campaigns, including: helped over 200 students apply for Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals program; Massachusetts driver's license/Real ID; in-state tuition for immigrants; Bill of Rights campaign with the Massachusetts Coalition of Domestic Workers and the National Domestic Workers Alliance.

Field daily requests for information and help in areas including: education (early childhood through university); ESL; health care; employment; workers' rights; domestic violence; sexual harassment; immigration.

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Maintain a bilingual website and distribute regular "e-newsletters" to a list of over 1000.

Maintain a small lending library.
